18th SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The readings this week are again
very powerful and very much apt
for us as we continue to cluster.

Isaiah reminds us that our
relationship with God is one by
invitation nor by coercion. This
means God respects our freedom
but it also means our commitment
must be very personal and
intentional. I have to commit to
the God who made me to live
forever whatever hand life deals
me.

Paul reminds both Romans and
Patricians (Members of St.
Patrick) that even clustering
cannot keep us from loving God.
A new twist for all of us.

Lastly, like Peter, in these times,
we tell God "whatever" and then
we get scared. What we have to
remember is that when fear sets
in, God is there to pull us out.

As Abraham was once asked to
sacrifice his son through whom
God promised Abraham he would
be the father of many nations,
God asks us to say "Whatever" as
this good man did.

And we certainly can trust that
God will say to us: "Now that I
know that you are willing to
sacrifice all, I perhaps needn't ask
you to do so. TRUST.
