21ST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The readings this week contrast
Wisdom of the World and wisdom of
God.

Isaiah tells us that God does not rate
us by standards of the world. Our
eternal salvation does not depend on
power, influence, consumerism,
acquisition, or entitlement. It depends
on character, caring presence, and
fidelity to our God.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus
places the Mission he has come to
accomplish before the apostles only
to find them thinking like their
contemporaries.

But is this not an essential flaw for
each of us each day? How easily if
forget the biblical images of church:
Leaven:

I'm not to think as the world does –
I'm so to live that the world may
discover how to prioritize.

Light –

My example of decision, goal-setting,
direction, value must enable
the world to see the value of a life
given to the service of others rather
than a life based on the values the
world holds dear.

Salt

My presence in the world must so
powerfully affect others that I draw
forth from them the image of Christ
that resides in each one of us – no
matter how cleverly people disguise
that image.

In the running of my life, which is the
governing factor:

WISDOM OF THE WORLD
OR WISDOM OF GOD?
