EXALTATION OF HOLY CROSS

Today's Feast calls us to awareness
of the fundamentals of our faith.
God showed the depths of His love for
us by a total commitment to identify
with his creation in becoming one of
us. In so doing, the first lesson
spoken in deed is “One must move
beyond self completely if one is to
love as God loves. Our first response
is to ask our God to help us be as
generous as God in moving beyond
self to discover God in serving others.

The book of Numbers calls us to
realize that in our daily struggles to
deal with life's challenges, we often
Lose perspective. We ask our God to
keep us focused and reminded that
life without resurrection is most
challenging indeed.

Paul spells out for us and for the
people of Philippi the depth of the
commitment of our God to us in love.

And Jesus in the Gospel of John
reminds the people of His own day
and us as well that we are to look to
Christ to find meaning in our lives.
Christ was the forerunner – the one
who traveled the way first and in so
doing revealed to us that life is eternal
– not bound by time.

In a very real sense, Jesus did not
become one of us in order to do away
with pain, but rather to give meaning
to pain. It is part of the training
process to enable us to be faithful
when difficult to do so. But the depth
of its meaning will be understood only
in eternity where the masterpiece of
the life of each of us can be seen in its
fullness.
