25TH SUNDAY OR ORDINARY TIME

Henry Nouwen, a spiritual writer once described the spiritual life as a process of changing the interior monologue we engage in each day into a dialogue with the God in whom we “live and move and have our being.” It’s not I who am living, hurting, discerning, planning, worshipping, wondering – it’s we – God and I together.

He is echoing the readings of this week. Isaiah tells us we are totally dependent on our God – God is all around. Seek God. Honor God, Know God. God doesn’t think as I do. Don’t tell God what to do. LISTEN.

Paul tells us that we are to walk worthy of the Gospel of Jesus. We have been commissioned to give to the world the experience of God’s unconditional love for all people. It’s my job. I can’t disappoint God but again, it’s a job that God and I do together, and as long as I do not take credit for the good that’s accomplished, fantastic things happen.

Jesus, in the story of the vineyard owner, reminds us that God is in charge. Life is God’s gift to me and God has given me talents, family, friends, abilities and charged me to use them to the fullest.

When we recognize that we are walking through life in partnership with the God who made us, and we are never alone, life becomes beautiful, and there’s nothing that God and I can’t handle together. But I need to walk with God.
