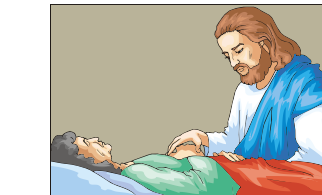

26TH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

The readings this week all have to do with our relationship with God

Ezekiel tells us that God's way of dealing with us is such that if we are faithful, God is pleased with us – if we are not, God is not pleased with us. If our hearts are attuned to doing the will of God we will never go wrong.

We are also charged to continue the caring presence of Jess in the world of our day.

Paul reminds us that God emptied Himself of divinity, omnipotence, eternity and dignity in becoming one of us in Jesus. If we are to continue Christ's presence, we too must move beyond self and seek to serve all of our brothers and sisters.

As the Psalmist puts it: “My sheep hear me. “I know them and they follow me.”

Lastly, the Jesus of Matthew's Gospel reminds us that to express our willingness to serve God is commendable but our following through and being there for Christ is what is of importance.

These issues are interesting ones. Further thoughts include: How well do I listen to God? Am I grateful for what I have? Do I simply look to what I don't have and ask?

How often do I tell God what I want Him to do as opposed to asking what God asks of me?
