30th SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Moses tells the people of Israel and us
as well that we are to care for the
stranger and the alien in our midst.
Our love for God must ever find
expression in our care for one
another.

Paul tells the people of Ephesus that
they could always be sure that they
were showing love for God when they
took care of the poor in their midst.
Our faith too is most eloquent when it
finds expression not merely in words
but in the lives we lead.

Jesus repeats this insight in the
Acclamation in saying "If you love me,
you will keep my word. And Jesus
adds a promise – we will come to
spend time with you – visit you.

Finally, asked by one as to which was
the greatest commandment, Jesus
said: "You shall love God above all
things and your neighbor as yourself.

With these commands in place,
how would we answer the following
questions...

How does my love for God find
expression?

What things have changed in my life
because of Christ?

What one thing is there, the
changing of which would make me a
better person – more beloved of God?

How much quality time have I spent
with God. When was the last time we
Sat down and really talked?
