FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

Kingship today has overtones of power, governance, being in charge – all of which God obviously is – and Jesus, as God become one of us is most assuredly is as well.

But the prophet Ezekiel portrays the role of authority in terms of the shepherd's care for his flock- by nurturing, protect ting, leading and loving.

Do I see God as a loving God – Christ as one who leaves 99 sheep to search after each of the lost ones? If Christ can prioritize me to such a degree, how have I prioritized Christ in my life? Where God's law conflicted with my preferences or cramped my style, who won – God or I?

Paul portrays Jesus the king as the one who has gone before us to show us the way. As Christ rose from the dead, we too are to rise. Christ was king for Paul by modeling how this life derives its total meaning from the life for which we were made forever. How does this show in my life?

Lastly, what are the expectations of Christ of me? They are summed up in:

WHEN IT ALL COMES OUT IN THE WASH, WHAT QUALIFIES US FOR ENTRANCE INTO THE REIGN OF CHRIST OUR KING IS:
LOVE ONE ANOTHER AS I HAVE LOVED YOU.
