PENTECOST SUNDAY 2010

Pentecost is the Feast of the
coming of the Spirit of God upon
the Apostles and on the Leaven
Community today.

Pentecost celebrates the
transformation of each of us as we
become people whose lives
themselves show the world what
life is all about.

We are transformed into what we
never had been before. Now it's
exciting to deal with life's tough
stuff because it shows the world
that we were made to live forever
And this is what gives meaning to
our lives.

It means an openness to change –
it means a joy that none can take
from us since Jesus conquered the
world by His death and resurrection

In the Gospel of John, Jesus gives
the apostles the peace which the
world cannot give.

He links it with forgiveness and
thus profoundly tells us that
without forgiveness from the heart,
there is no peace that will last.

The issues raised by the feast:

1. How has my life been
transformed since the
Spirit has come to me?
2. How open am I to change
since it is change that is
key to transformation.
3. How much have I given
by forgiving as God does
– whether others deserve
it or not.
