14<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Our readings this week, call us to  
keep our perspective as we travel  
thru a very mesmerizing world.

Isaiah tells us that God will comfort  
us as a mother comforts her child.  
Do I see the hand of God working  
through the circumstances of my  
day, fashioning me into the person  
God wishes me to be so I can touch  
the lives of others with God's love.  
Do I remember my goal – a life in  
eternal happiness with my God?  
How does this give meaning to my  
life?

Paul tells the Galatians that they  
and we are to be crucified to the  
world, and the world to us.  
To be crucified to the world means  
that the world's way of thinking is  
foreign to me – what it prizes –  
nothing. My perspective is different  
and will never be that of the here  
and now. My citizenship is in  
heaven. If this is true, how much of  
my life is lived from Christ's  
perspective as opposed to that of  
the world?

In the Gospel, Christ tells those  
who are conscious God leads them  
thru life – those who are crucified  
to the world and what it prizes –  
Christ tells them and us to go forth  
and bear much fruit. Jesus once  
said to his disciples: "Remain in  
me and you will bear much fruit."

I see God in every event. I have put  
the world's way of thinking out of  
my mind. I am sent forth by Christ  
to bear much fruit by remaining in  
Him. On this my eternity rests.
